



COVID-19 School Reentry Communication: 3 of 4

July 19, 2020

Dear Lynnhaven Community,

The first day of the new school year is upon us. The faculty, staff, and administration are working hard to ensure we have the right processes and procedures in place as we plan to resume in-person instruction next month. It's truly one of the most remarkable challenges we have faced as a school community. The singular focus is to have consistency in learning while ensuring we are doing it safely and responsibly.

Coronavirus is a very serious and deadly disease. I, along with the COVID Task Force, are taking all necessary precautions to safeguard your student as much as possible. Over the last 30 days, things have changed again in the Commonwealth and around the country in the fight against COVID-19. After careful consideration and reflection about how best to provide instruction to your student in light of this new data, I have been left with very tough decisions about how to resume in-person instruction. Let me be clear, the decisions that I have made are based on safety, science, and a firm understanding of the learners and families in our beloved community. It is important that we as a community come together during this unprecedented and often unpredictable time to ensure the best possible outcomes for our students.

Status of Reopening

Lynnhaven Academy will re-open for in-person learning in August; however, the start date has been moved to Monday, August 24th. Our official academic calendar can be found [HERE](#).

The COVID Task Force meets on a weekly basis to review data and new best practice guidelines and plan the reopening of Lynnhaven's campus. When we began [communicating](#) this spring, our goal plan to reopen fully in-person, five days a week beginning August 19, 2020. At our most recent meeting, the Task Force carefully weighed the current trend of increased cases across the six localities of which our families reside, the social and emotional well being of our faculty, staff, and families, as well as Lynnhaven's preparedness. Additionally, the task force heard concerns from a large number of Lynnhaven families about their students returning to full five-day instruction. These concerns were echoed by members of the task force and a more methodical and measured approach was decided upon. Lynnhaven will operate in

a Hybrid Learning Model for the 2020-2021 school year. **You can read *Our Path Forward* in its entirety attached to this letter. There you will find pertinent information about student schedules, health practices, and expectations for the coming school year.** Lynnhaven will host a live Town Hall Q&A on Wednesday, July 29th at 6pm. Orientation and School Registration Forms

Lynnhaven has converted all handouts, registration forms, and permissions that are typically disseminated and collected during orientation to electronic forms. Mrs. White, our new Director of Admissions, started contacting families to aid in completing the necessary enrollment and registration requirements last week. Additionally, the Task Force determined that orientation will now be recorded and not a live Zoom Meeting event that was initially scheduled from August 3-6.
